## IMPORTANT INFORMATION

### **Jacketed Ammunition**

The use of jacketed ammunition is prohibited on any Pine Valley Pistol Club ranges. To save any embarrassment and possible DQ please comply with this WA Police directive.

All suspect ammunition will be checked and should a competitor be found to be using jacketed projectiles, he or she will be DQ'd.

### **INTERSTATE COMPETITORS TRAVELING WITH FIREARMS TO WESTERN AUSTRALIA**

**Please note:** The Western Australian Police Service currently does not recognise firearm licences issued in other Australian States or Territories. You will be required to obtain a Temporary Permit from the Western Australian Police Service for any firearm(s) they bring into the Western Australia. The Application Form can be downloaded from the Western Australian Police Service web site: [www.police.wa.gov.au](http://www.police.wa.gov.au).

The Western Australian Police do not recognise other state or territory licences. Some other states do not require permits for firearms temporarily entering their states as they do recognise each other's firearm licences.

What this means is every firearm coming into WA has to have a permit issued for the duration of the stay. This means that a fully licensed shooter cannot take another fully licensed shooter's firearm to WA.

WA Firearm Regulation is that the firearm coming into the state must be accompanied by the licence holder. In the case of juniors I would suggest that a member of the squad they are shooting with would be the licence holder.

A similar situation would apply where a competitor needs to "borrow" a firearm from another competitor. The licence holder would make the application for the permit to bring the firearm to WA and would also be in the same squad as the person "borrowing" the firearm for the match.

Clearly in both the above cases the actual licence holder is responsible at all times for the use of the firearm while it is in WA.
